



## HISTORIAL 50th ANNIVERSARY EXPO

The “Half a Century of Knowledge” Expo is a museum-like exhibition that aims to retrace the highlights of scientific research developed at the Tecnológico de Monterrey and throughout the world in the last 50 years.

It consists of two time-lines (ranging from 1970 to 2020) that run parallel and cross over occasionally. One time-line follows the history of research at the Tecnológico de Monterrey, from the first Research and Development Congress (in 1971), including the creation of the first research center, the upsurge of patented inventions, leading to scientific discoveries that have had the greatest impact.

Another time-line follows the advances of science and technology in Mexico and throughout the world, from the development of the Internet (in 1970) to the first-ever published images of a black hole (in 2019), in addition to micro-processor developments, Dolly as the first cloned mammal, and the discovery of water on Mars.

This Expo aims to trace briefly the history of science and technology in the last 50 years by using a simple but attractive and functional museum-like display as a science communication tool.
